

What to do in the case of a student presenting with symptoms:

SECONDARY/ADULT/VOC ED STUDENTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolation for 5 days ➤ after isolation if symptoms have reduced and no fever for 24 hours, can then return to school ➤ wearing of mask to continue and distance of 2m is maintained, if possible, during the following 5 days 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolation for 10 days
ELEMENTARY STUDENTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolation for 5 days ➤ negative rapid test at 5 days prior to return to class ➤ if rapid test is positive, additional 5 days 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolation for 5 days ➤ negative rapid test at 5 days prior to return to class ➤ if rapid test is positive, additional 5 days
PRESCHOOL (K4/K5)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolate for 5 days ➤ negative rapid test at 5 days prior to return to class ➤ if rapid test is positive, additional 5 days ➤ mask not obligatory 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolation for 5 days ➤ negative rapid test at 5 days prior to return to class ➤ if rapid test is positive, additional 5 days ➤ mask not obligatory
SPECIALIZED CLASSES (Chelsea Centre, Aylmer Centre, Transitions – Eardley)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolate for 5 days ➤ negative rapid test at 5 days prior to return to class ➤ if rapid test is positive, additional 5 days ➤ if unable to wear mask, mask not obligatory 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolate for 5 days ➤ negative rapid test at 5 days prior to return to class ➤ if rapid test is positive, additional 5 days ➤ if unable to wear mask, mask not obligatory

Household members (including adults) are considered high-risk contacts. Instructions for household members (ONLY) of student presenting with symptoms:

If household members who are contacts, become symptomatic, follow the instructions for isolation, relative to their individual situation and vaccination status.

Classroom contacts are not considered high-risk contacts, therefore they do not require self-isolation.

SECONDARY STUDENTS/ADULT/VOC ED who are household contacts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolation at the same time as the student with symptoms ➤ isolation for 5 days ➤ wearing of mask to continue and distance of 2m is maintained, if possible, during the following 5 days
ELEMENTARY STUDENTS who are household contacts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ isolation at the same time as the student with symptoms ➤ isolation for 5 days ➤ negative rapid test at 5 days prior to return to class ➤ if rapid test is positive, additional 5 days
