Term 3 Report Card	The Term 3 Report Card will be issued and available through Mosaik by <b>June 30</b> th. It will	
	cover the period from February 13 <sup>th</sup> to the end of the year and will count for 60% of the

Report Card: How Results Are Determined

For Terms 1 and 2, the teacher enters a percentage mark that reflects the knowledge and competencies that a student has acquired - based on the evaluations carried out during the term (tests, assignments, etc.).  In the case of English Language Arts, Mathematics and French, Second Language, a Subject Mark is calculated based on the weightings assigned to the subject-specific competencies established by Ministry of Education (see subject table on the first page).		For the 3 <sup>rd</sup> Term, the teacher enters a percentage mark that covers the student's learning as a whole for the year (knowledge and competencies).	The 3 <sup>rd</sup> term includes a Final Mark.  It is calculated using the results of the three weighted terms (20%, 20%, 60%), the Ministry and school board exam results (if applicable).

## **Comments on Learning (by Subject)**

The report card includes a section for general teacher comments for each subject area. The comments will deal with the student's strengths, challenges, progress, and areas on which to work that will help lead to success. In the final term, comments will be included if the student has been unsuccessful in one or more competencies.
